Until **19 November 2024**, we are inviting applications for the position of an **Ethics Subject Matter Expert**. The position is full-time in a hybrid working environment. The cost to company for this position is negotiable and will take the current remuneration into consideration.

MAIN FUNCTION

Providing professional advisory services to client organisations, conducting relevant research, providing thought leadership, developing policies for clients, and conducting training.

POST REQUIREMENTS

- A second or third degree related to the field of organisational ethics.
- At least six years' work experience in the field of organisational ethics or a related field.
- Project management skills - ability to manage projects from initiation to completion.
- Ability to build and maintain healthy relationships with colleagues, clients and other stakeholders.
- Independent worker with a high level of initiative, but also a good team player.
- Ability to work to deadlines and under pressure.
- Ability to interact with TEI clients at all levels – from an executive level to semi- and unskilled employees, including representatives of labour unions who represent the latter group/level.
- Exposure to the State-Owned Entity sector would be an advantage.
- Excellent writing, editing, and oral communication skills in English.
- Excellent MS Office and general computer skills; and
- Excellent interpersonal etiquette.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Submit a full-length Curriculum Vitae (inclusive of your identity number) on or before the **19 November 2024** to Remofiloe Kale at remofiloe@tei.org.za.
- Submit a letter of motivation explaining why you should be appointed as an **Ethics Subject Matter Expert** at The Ethics Institute. Your letter should also indicate how your skill set will make a valuable contribution to the services that TEI offers.
- Applications should be submitted as PDF documents.
- Applicants will be disqualified if applications are not submitted according to the listed requirements.
- No late applications will be considered.

RESPONSIBILITIES would include, but are not limited to:

1. Professional advisory services:

- (a) Conceptualising projects and writing of project proposals
- (b) Consulting with clients to design, develop and implement ethics management or anti-corruption programmes, or whistleblowing management systems
- (c) Developing innovative approaches, instruments, and frameworks to support client organisations in the implementation of their Ethics Management / Anti-Corruption Programmes
- (d) Conducting assessments and highlighting areas of risk from an ethical perspective in client organisations
- (e) Developing ethics strategies, policies and codes of ethics customised to the client organisation
- (f) Consulting with clients and seeking opportunities for the sale of additional services

2. Research, thought leadership and standard setting:

- a) Conducting specialised research to support and advance the importance of Ethics, Whistleblowing and Anti-Corruption
- b) Developing frameworks and guidelines to inform Ethics, Whistleblowing and Anti-Corruption policy and practices
- c) Developing leading practice guidance in collaboration with expert partners
- d) Drafting media releases, opinion pieces and engaging with public media
- e) Serving on, or representing TEI on relevant governance and advisory bodies

3. Training:

- a) Developing new training programmes and updating current training programmes
- b) Conducting training for clients and open programmes

4. Project leadership and team management:

- a) Designing and managing project teams
- b) Overseeing outputs of project teams
- c) Reporting on project statuses
- d) Mentoring new team members
